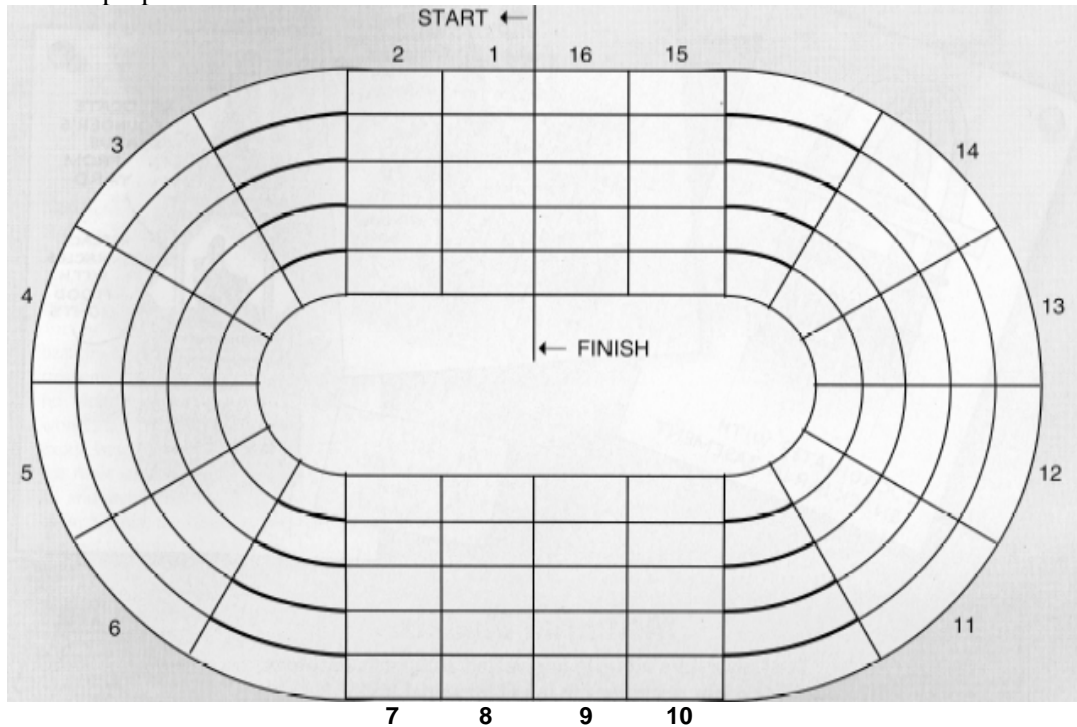


Puzzle

"One Hundred Laps"

Instructions: The cryptic clues define sixteen radial words (1 to 16) and twelve circular words (unnumbered). Radial words are to be entered reading either in or out; you must determine which. Circular words, four of which have no clues, are to be entered counterclockwise from the starting line in the order of their clues, beginning in the outermost lane, three or four to a lane. Answers include one proper name.

2. An era returns in theater
3. Pair support
4. Arson foiled by acoustics
5. Senseless from pain anesthesia
6. Provoked turning around in delirium
7. With regard to having uranium: get used to it
8. Pass; alternatively blush
9. Banish late key sound
10. Note time split
11. Keen small instrument
12. Concepts aside, is different
13. Keen about inert gas transport
14. Drudge to put aside around fifty
15. Declare time to turn away
16. Summer snake?
